Introduction

Welcome to the Calderdale ‘What Next?’ booklet - We hope you find it useful

An Education, Health and Care (EHC) Plan is written to help you learn, develop independence skills and achieve your hopes, dreams and aspirations.

Your EHC Plan is reviewed every year to make sure it is up to date and focuses on what you need to help you achieve the best outcomes for you.

Annual Reviews from Year 9 onwards include an important focus on preparing for adulthood. Thinking about preparing for adulthood makes sure that your EHC Plan looks forward to:

- Employment and or volunteering;
- Independent living;
- Friends, relationships and being an active member of your community;
- Maintaining good health.

This will help you prepare for when it is time to leave school or college.

There is a lot of help available in Calderdale to support young people.

This booklet is part of the preparing for adulthood focus. It includes:

- Information on possible education opportunities after Y11;
- The support available to help you further develop independence after leaving school;
- Ideas on local community support.

Reading the booklet at home and in school will help give you an idea of the options open to you.

You do not have to plan everything in detail at Year 9 but it is important that you begin to look ahead. The EHC Plan Annual Reviews can help you do this. Your school will make sure that these reviews are really helpful for you.



Education:

Education after Y11 can be planned around individual interests and aspirations.

Most young people continue education in the Calderdale area. Some young people follow A Level courses at a local school before considering university options.

Other young people look at vocational courses. You can find out about some of the options on pages 6 to 10.

Some young people look at courses out of the Calderdale area, perhaps at Kirklees College, Huddersfield New College or Leeds City College. Occasionally young people look at specialist colleges.

At school you can talk about possible education and training opportunities with an adviser from C&K Careers.

Whichever school or college you look at, it is important that you discuss this with the Special Educational Needs (SEN) team. Their contact details are:

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The Flexible 5 Day Offer

What we do

The Five Day Offer is a supportive framework which focuses on young people aged 18+ with a learning disability who are leaving full time education. It helps them to create a positive transition from school to college and employment by developing links around further learning, independent living skills, volunteering, paid work and leisure in their local community.

About us

Referrals are made to us through the Special Educational Needs and Disability (SEN) Team. Young people will be referred to the Five Day Offer if they:

- have had an Education, Health and Care plan
- are aged 18-25
- have a recognised learning disability
- are resident in Calderdale
- are interested in opportunities/things to do in Calderdale, eg. further education (Calderdale College), Adult Education (Calderdale Adult Learning at Heath), voluntary work, paid work and leisure activities.

Calderdale College

What we do

Calderdale College offers a wide variety of Vocational courses from Entry Level to Higher Education for 16-18 year olds or 16-25 year olds with an EHC Plan and adult learners.

For young people who require a quieter, more specialised learning space, the College has a discreet Specialist Learning provision called Employability and Life Skills. Our mission is to support young people with SEND to progress on to meaningful destinations to support their life and career goals.

About us

The Employability & Life Skills curriculum area provides an entry level academic programme to young people with Special Educational Needs and Disabilities (SEND), which focuses on life skills and qualification attainment, including maths and English. We also offer a non-accredited study programme, Move On, and internal Supported Internships

Our courses build on specific independence skills to support transition into further vocational study, supported internships and employment. We also support young people to complete their education before moving into adult care packages.

For those taking a vocational course, additional support is also available for those with identified needs including in class support, dyslexia, dyscalculia, Exam concessions, specialist 1:1s and ASD pastoral support. This is assessed and assigned once the student has enrolled.

Project Search is a work-based route sited at Calderdale Royal Hospital in Halifax. This is an intensive supported internship programme which fully prepares young people to move into paid employment and apprenticeships.

Project Challenge

What we do

Project Challenge is an award winning charity delivering bespoke statutory Study Programmes of learning over 3 days per week. The offer is roll on/off so young people can join at any time in the academic year.

The tutors are qualified Youth Workers first and teachers second giving us a different approach to mainstream education. We understand that not all young people learn in formal classroom settings so have developed small group programmes that are individualised, practical and challenging. Our aim is to provide educational qualifications and build learner confidence.

We offer two vocational skills courses: Sport and Hospitality and Functional Skills Maths and English from Entry 1 to Level 2 in addition to these courses we have recently added a new course called Vocational Studies.

Life skills activities are also part of the offer with sessions and workshops on activities such as; budgeting, employability, work experience in our café, confidence building and personal development.

Project Search

What we do

Project SEARCH provides students age 18+ with the chance to work for local businesses and institutions with the aim of gaining paid work in the future. This course is free for students age 18+ with an Education, Health and Care Plan. This is a work-based learning option that offers hands on opportunities to try out different job roles and work with a teacher and job coach to develop work skills and apply them in a real work situation. There are no qualifications attached to Project Search as the focus of the course is to help people into employment. All students will receive full support in their work and studies.



About us

Calderdale Royal Hospital is the host business providing employment opportunities in various roles including reception, housekeeping, administration and portering. The students currently work in a variety of departments including the IT Department, Stroke Rehabilitation Wards, Resuscitation Training department and with ISS, one of the main contractors within the hospital. The course also focuses on supporting students to improve their interview skills, create a CV and register with job sites and complete application forms to better improve their chances of achieving paid work.

All learning takes place at the host employer with a College tutor and a Job Coach supporting the teaching and skills development. Delivery methods include group work, role play, multi modal blended learning and practical activities in the classroom and out in the community.


Autism Employment Support

Café HX1

What we do

Each year Café HX1 provides 4 adults (age 19+) with a learning disability an opportunity to develop their skills in the field of catering and hospitality. Each student completes 2 days practical work in a kitchen environment based at Higgins Close day service providing a meals and drinks service to approximately 30 people. The students also develop their knowledge about food safety in a classroom setting. The programme starts in December each year and concludes in December the next year. During the year long programme students develop their knowledge and skills with the aim of being better able to gain paid employment. The programme offers the opportunity to gain experience in other catering establishments in order to further confidence and skills.

What we do

Specialist Inclusion Team

The Specialist Inclusion Team is responsible for the support of children and young people with Autistic Spectrum Disorder, hearing and/or visual impairment from birth into adult services. It is one of several available for children and young people and comprises two teams:

The Sensory Team provides specialist support for children and young people. There are 3 sensory teams:

- Hearing Impairment Team
- Visual Impairment Team
- Multi-Sensory Impairment Team

We are an education support service, operating predominantly during term time. We offer family support, assessment, training, teaching and advice to schools and settings for children and young people from 0 to 25.

The Autistic Spectrum Disorder Team offers a specialist service to mainstream schools, early years settings and colleges.

We provide support and advice for children and young people with a confirmed diagnosis of ASD, aged 0 to 25 years in Calderdale, to successfully access the learning and social environment, work towards independence and achieve their potential.

We support adults and young people who have a learning or physical disability to focus on building resilience and independence so that we can help adults to be as independent as they can be. We have close links with Ravenscliffe, Ryburn, Calderdale College and the SEN team and meet with individuals before they leave education to ensure they are aware of what support is available to them. Direct Payments

What are Direct Payments?

Anyone who has had an assessment from Calderdale Council that identifies a need for care or support can ask for a direct payment. This is a cash payment made directly to you instead of the Council arranging services for you. The amount of money available to you depends on your level of need and will be different in every case.

Will it affect my benefits?

No. A direct payment is not a social security benefit and will not affect your entitlement to any means tested benefits such as Housing or Council Tax Benefit and Income Support. It is paid into a separate bank account so it doesn't get mixed up with your own money.

What can it be spent on?

The Council will tell you how much money you are entitled to and it is up to you how you spend it, as long as it is only used to meet your needs and it is legal. You have to tell the Council how you intend to spend the money and the Council have to agree your plan before you can get the money. Some people use their money to buy care from an agency, pay for short breaks, go to a private day centre or to buy equipment they need to keep them independent. Others choose to employ their own carers, often called Personal Assistants or PAs to help them.

You can't use a direct payment to pay for permanent residential or nursing care, or for anything that doesn't meet the outcomes you agreed with your assessor.



Will I get any help?

Yes, there's lots of help available. Calderdale Council has a team of staff who will help you to set up and manage your direct payment. This can include finding the right care agency, recruiting your own Personal Assistants, opening a bank account for the money to be paid into and keeping on top of the paperwork. They will keep an eye on how you are spending your direct payment and may ask you to return any unspent money at the end of the year.

You might need to use some of the money to take out insurance cover if you are employing your own Personal Assistants. The insurer will help you with any employment related issues you might have and help with redundancy costs in some cases.

If you are employing your own Personal Assistants you can use some of the money to have an organisation work out your carers wages, deal with their employment contracts and make sure your tax and national insurance contributions are up to date.

You can chose to spend some of the money to have an organisation manage the direct payment for you and make sure the bills are paid.
